Mrs. Roy is working with our 6th, 7th and 8th grade student volunteers to train and prepare them for their very important role as Safety Patrol in the morning. The main job these school leaders have is helping students safely out of their cars in the morning as the Administrative Team has been doing the first two weeks. These student volunteers work with members of the Admin team to make sure that you are greeted with a smile and most importantly, that your child gets safely into school. We really want to bring more to this program by having volunteers from EMS, the city or county police, fire department and other roles that involve keeping people safe come and visit our Safety Patrol for 30-45 minutes on and off

throughout the year and speak about their jobs, experiences, etc. with these students. We are also interested in a mini-field trip or two possibly to a fire station or something comparable.

Safety First! Car pick up/drop off reminders

Below are a few very important reminders for car drop off and pick up. Please follow these procedures for the safety

of your children and others as well as to support a more efficient process.

- Do not block sidewalks or driveways (church or Willie Stargell entrance)
- Be courteous of one another when entering on Wonder Way

from Wellington-take turns letting

cars onto Wonder Way from the right, then left side of the road.

- Stay to the left, close to the curb
 - Pull up close to the car in front of you so we can get as many cars off of Wellington as possible
 - SLOW DOWN! Remember, we have students and teachers all over our campus. Even 10mph is TOO fast on campus, particularly with all the turns and crosswalks.
 - Don't park on Wonder afternoons. We have to have emer-



CFCI Receives Green School of Excellence Award!!!


Cape Fear Center for Inquiry has received the Green School of Ex-


Welcome Back Luncheon for the teacher's the day of open house and they were so appreciative of the all the food that we were able to
