Morning & Drop-Off Reminders

Please share this information with everyone who drives your children to school:

- Please <u>do not</u> use the back entrance onto the campus during drop-off or pickup. That entrance is reserved for faculty, staff and busses.
- Please ensure that you pull all the way through and <u>do not</u> stop at the doors. We need to accommodate as many cars as possible along the sidewalk.
- Please <u>do not</u> get out of your car. Our safety patrol is here to help!

 not have your child run up the sidewalk. This is a safety concern.




We are in need of proctors for testing.

- Attend a proctor training at 8:15; this is give you all of the information that you need to be a successful proctor as well as a continental breakfast with coffee and juice.



In the past six years this event has raised approximately \$95,000 which has been applied towards improving the K-3 playground, the 4th-8th grade play space, designing and installing the first fitness stations, segments of the perimeter fitness path, tablet stations for classrooms, interactive outdoor learning spaces, a floating observation deck, and an outdoor classroom (soon to come!).

In the third quarter, 4th grade kicked off our Magnets and electricity unit with a trip to Cape Fear Museum learning lab.








