Contract Recommendations

School Psychologist Recommendation - Kelli Leiner

A panel of 4 members participated in interviews for the part-time School Psychologist position on Tuesday, July 10th. The panel is unanimously recommending Kelli Leiner.

Kelli has been a School Psychologist for ten years in the state of California. She has worked with students from Pre-K to 21+. She comes to us with a clear understanding of the different facets of this role. She understands the processes, procedures and laws surrounding special education, testing, IEP meetings, the discrepancy model as well as the transition to MTSS and using tiered interventions and data collection to determine student needs. The panel was excited by Kelli's knowledge of a variety of assessment tools and experiences with students who struggle both academically and emotionally.

In addition to being a School Psychologist, Kelli was also the Program Coordinator of Early Mental Health Intervention Programs which ties so strongly to our need to support students who struggle with mental health, and with social and emotional disorders. The panel unanimously feels that Kelli has the skill set and personality to fit into this position and into our school culture.

2nd-3rd Grade Teacher Recommendation- Austin Adams

A panel of 7 including teachers/teacher board members, teaching assistants, and administration interviewed 6 candidates for the 2nd-3rd grade teaching position. These were without a doubt, some of the strongest, most qualified candidates we have had to date. The panel truly enjoyed talking with each candidate, but in the end had a clear first choice. The panel unanimously recommends Austin Adams for the 2nd-3rd grade position.

Austin has completed 10 years of teaching 3rd-5th grade in the private and public school setting. One of the things that stood out to the panel about Austin was that teaching was his second career choice and that he chose to leave the business world where the pay was much higher, but his passion was so limited. He joined the world of teaching in 2008 and has loved it ever since!

Over the past ten years, Austin has developed quite a strong reputation in the local education community. He has served in leadership roles at all of his schools. His previous colleagues and supervisors shared that he has great relationships with his students, is fun and humorous, but also gets down to business in the classroom and that students, parents and colleagues enjoy working with him. He has been a trainer of his colleagues in mathematics and the Math Problem Solving Model. His students have consistently achieved high growth on End of Grade tests. He loves teaching, enjoys just being kids and shared with us that CFCI is his dream school. The panel highly recommends Austin Adams for this position.

Head School Custodian Recommendation- Jeff Barnes

On July 3. 2018, the CFCI Board of Directors approved a full-time custodian position to help address some of the cleanliness concerns that have been identified over time in our building. Our buildings on Wonder Way have never been as clean as they were during the short time Mr. Jeff Barnes worked for the company we contracted with. On July 5, 2018, Kathy Coke and I met with Jeff for an interview and discussion about the position. Mr. Barnes was overjoyed with the opportunity!
