

CFCI Grading Protocols 2019-20

Thank you for your patience, understanding and support during these unprecedented times surrounding COVID-19. It is our goal to provide you with accurate, up to date information to help alleviate concerns and address your questions. The North Carolina State Board of Education and the Department of Public Instruction have provided guidance on grading as students are learning from home. Based on this guidance and the announcement schools will be closed for face-to-face instruction for the remainder of the 2019-2020 academic year, we want to share the following information regarding grading:

Elementary Grading Protocol

Kindergarten through Grade 5

- Teachers will provide students with meaningful feedback to promote student growth.
- Teachers will monitor the progress of students in order to provide academic support.
- Grades 2-5 students will not receive a final grades. CFCI grades 2-5 students will receive a final report card with grades for the first and second trimesters only (T1, T2). Teachers will provide year-end written feedback for students/families based on their learning this school year.
- Kindergarten and Grade 1 will not receive final grades instead they will receive a final report card with grades for the first semester (S1) along with year-end written feedback for students/families based on their learning this school year.
- Academic and social/emotional feedback will be used to help transition students into the new school year.

Middle School Grading Protocol

- Students will receive feedback on their remote learning assignments. Completion of assignments will be recorded in Powerschool. Grades will be recorded in PowerSchool and available for parents to see in the Parent Portal. A student's final grade will be recorded as a PC19 code or a WC19 code.
 - The **PC19** code means a student was passing his/her course as of March 13.
 - The **WC19** code means a student has not mastered the course content as of March 13.
- Teachers will continue to work with students on mastering content until May 29th. Grades earned during remote learning can only be used to provide feedback and improve a student's grade.

Students needing additional instructional support can reach their teachers during set office hours for small group and individual help.
- Students in NC Math 1 will have the option of receiving a numerical grade, PC19, or WC19 in Powerschool for their final grade. Grading from NCVPS will be available by June 4th.
