Teachers also spent time looking at their scope and sequence by grade level to ensure our students are experiencing a well aligned curriculum over their years with us at CFCI.


We are lucky to have a staff dedicated to continuous improvement and lifelong learning!

Mid Year Blues? How to help your student stay motivated!




#### **GLOBAL STUDIES IS TOILET TWINNING - WILMINGTWIN, NC**

We've been hard at work learning the United Nations 17 Sustainable Development Goals. We have chosen a project that addresses the first 6 goals: No Poverty, Zero Hunger, Good Health and Well-Being, Gender Equality and Clean Water and Sanitation. We are working with <a href="ToiletTwinning.org">ToiletTwinning.org</a> to improve sanitation and help people around the world.

Toilet Twinning works in some of the poorest countries on the planet to teach people how to build toilets and educate them about the link between sanitation and health. For only \$80 a toilet can be twinned in your home, business, school or church. We need 30 partners in Wilmington to twin with us in order for our city to become THE FIRST TWINNED CITY IN AMERICA. We are trying to do something that has never been done and can literally save lives! We are also trying to twin a block toilets in a school that doesn't currently have any. If you want to donate and be a part of this big movement, you can send money in with your student and the teacher will collect it. OR you can donate securely from home by visiting our fundraising page!

Here's how you can donate online!

- 1. Go to <u>lustgiving.com</u> and search CFCI. You will find our fundraiser page.
- 2. Donate! It costs \$80 to twin your toilet. Want to make a smaller donation? No problem! You can enter any amount! In the comment section leave the name of your student's classroom if you want the donation count towards crowning their teacher the CFCI toilet King or Queen.
- 3. If you chose to twin your personal toilet or a toilet at your business, then email Amanda Brust (abrust@cfci.net). Indicate the name of your business name and select a country from the list below to twin in:
  - Afghanistan, Côte d'Ivoire, Democratic Republic of Congo, Honduras, Malawi, Mozambique, Nigeria, The Republic of South Sudan, Uganda, Zambia
- 4. We will send all of our donations to <u>Toilettwinning.org</u> and receive a certificate for your toilet showing a picture of it's twinned toilet along with the GPS coordinates that you can look up on google maps. We will send your toilet's certificate to you. Think how great it will look framed and hanging over your toilet!
  - Please help us make Wilmin-Twin a reality! Share our idea with your neighbors, friends and family! Tell local businesses about our project and how they can partner with us! 
#### **GROUNDHOG WEATHER SCHOOL AND READ ALOUD DAY**




#### THANK YOU! - FIRST GRADE SUCCESSFUL DONATIONS DRIVE!!!
