As a reminder:



*All meetings will be held in in-person at CFCI.*






"Buddies" are a CFCI tradition! Here is Grade 2 with their 6th Grade buddies.



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## The Middle Grades Retreat is Back!

Middle Grades Retreat at the Betsy Jeff Penn 4-H Center is back! The students in grades 6-8 enjoyed their time away and will have lots of great stories to tell over the next few weeks.

**Our 6-8 students experienced** the incredible Soaring Thru Spaces Program at the Betsy-Jeff Penn 4-H Center for three amazing days!

This program is specially designed to help middle grades experience and develop life skills. *Communication, teamwork, cooperation, problem-solving, goal setting, and leadership are not always easily taught in the classroom. The Soaring Thru Spaces Program utilizes ground initiatives, communication exercises, trust-building activities, team challenge course elements (low ropes), and depending on the group the high ropes course to accomplish these learning goals. The High Ropes Course allows students to set goals, push beyond their comfort zone, bask in the support of teammates, and realize their own abilities. The BJP belief is that individuals are often more capable mentally, physically, and emotionally than they actually perceive themselves to be. If given the opportunity to try new challenges in a supportive atmosphere, they will be able to discover the excellence within themselves.*

## Inner Spaces:

Knowing oneself, setting goals, overcoming fears, coping with change, and making effective personal decisions.



## Shared Spaces:

Group interaction, problem-solving with peers, communication skills, conflict management, and making effective group decisions.



## Ultimate challenge: As a team, work together and problem-solve effectively.

If given the opportunity to try new challenges in a supportive atmosphere, students will discover the excellence within themselves.


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## Weekly Wellness with Nurse Jenn and Mrs. Horne

with ADHD. During this month, we work to spread the word about what ADHD is, how it impacts our children, and resources to help. An ADHD diagnosis can come with a lot of challenges, so it's important to seek professional help if necessary. Be sure to speak with your child's teacher or school counselor if you have any questions about how to help your child succeed.


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## Our Constitutional Convention - New Date: Tuesday, October 25th

We have rescheduled our Constitutional Convention to Tuesday, October 25th at 1:45pm! Over the past six weeks of school, our teachers have been working in our classrooms to develop rules and expectations that help our students learn and live together. This week, we will finalize our schoolwide rules that have been developed by representatives from each of the classes. After sharing their classroom rules last week, students worked together to decide the schoolwide rules that would best align with their classroom rules and give all students a sense of belonging. We look forward to creating visible artwork that represents our rules to hang in the hallway of our school. The rules will be presented to the entire school at the end of the week. Everyone will sign the rules as a way of committing to the schoolwide rules that have been created. Engaging all of students in the rule-setting process helps them take ownership of the rules. Engaging all of the adults emphasizes for the children the significance of their work. Together, we are creating a calmer, happier place for learning.

Teachers find over and over that this investment of time and effort is well worth the payoff of calm, productive, and joyful classrooms.
