


CFCI Community Update 11/11/22

Safety Patrol and Arrival/Dismissal - PLEASE READ!

We wanted to send families the following reminders and updates concerning arrival and dismissal:



Arrival:

Lower Lot - Please ensure that your child exits the car at the spot

you first stop at. Waiting to pull up closer to the K/1 door creates slowdowns and unsafe traffic conditions. Please be aware that starting Monday 11/7 there will be student Safety Patrol members to help students out of cars. **We ask that you do not exit your car during arrival.** If your child needs assistance, please wait for a staff or Safety Patrol member to assist them. Please be aware that safety patrol members will be dropped off between 7:40-7:45. These cars have been given permission to enter the lower lot through the back entrance. For cars that line up prior to 7:45, please do not pull forward until 7:45.

Upper Lot - When and if the number of cars in the lot results in traffic stacking on Shipyard, we ask that you form a double line when entering the lot, to avoid creating an unsafe traffic situation.

Dismissal:

Stacking on Shipyard and Wellington continues to occur at times. This is an unsafe traffic condition that we all need to work to avoid. In order to do so, we ask that all families continue to do the following:

- -Please pull up as much as possible (in a safe manner) while waiting in line.
- -Please try to arrive at your designated pick-up times. Families of students whose last name starts with letters A-M, we kindly ask that you begin arriving at 3:00. Families of students whose last name starts with letters N-Z, we kindly ask that you begin arriving at 3:15. We understand that certain situations result in families being unable to make these times exactly, but we ask that you try as much as possible, to help us maintain a safe dismissal procedure.


