Sweatshirt Sales





Students in Ms. Jordan's class scampered like chipmunks, testing whether it's better to carry acorns in their "paws" or their pockets!





Students collected acorns outside.

Our 8th grade students were appreciative of the opportunity and we all thank these amazing students who are hard working and impressive in their commitment to high school and beyond!







Sometimes the Best Professional Development is the Teacher Down the Hall!

Every day at CFCI, outstanding teaching and learning occurs campus-wide. Yet, CFCI's amazing teachers don't often have the opportunity to venture beyond the four walls of their own classrooms. They don't feasibly have the time in their structured day to get out and observe the inspiring teaching that brings learning to life down the hallway or even just next door.

This year, as one of CFCI's professional learning initiatives, teachers are investing time in is Responsive Classroom - our student-centered, social and emotional learning approach to teaching and discipline. We were fortunate to have four of our teachers attend a 4-day advanced course in Responsive Classroom this summer. They have come back prepared to share their knowledge as "teachers down the hall" experts with their colleagues. Julie Naylor, Carla Bromstead, Ali Balwin, and Cathi Mintz are engaging educators in opportunities that help refine familiar practices and strategies already being used with students. They are also introducing us new methods and strategies for supporting students' social, emotional, behavioral, and academic needs. In addition, other teachers are sharing their expertise and experiences by joining these 4 teachers in leading PD including: Madi Stimson, Jennifer Lafleur and Lisa Cole, among others.

This school year, CFCI teachers are practicing the philosophy that "the best professional development is the teacher down the hall"—living out the school's "Learn, Share, Live" motto. We are fortunate indeed to have these amazing faculty members to learn and grow from. We are proud of all of our educators and their commitment to professional development that improves their ability to support their students.
