Two exciting pieces of news we would like to share with all of you:

1. **SAVE THE DATE! Friday, March 31st** from 7-9 is our **Auction for Inquiry**. This year, our auction will focus on Art, Experiences, & Travel. This is our newly branded auction with an incredible team of parent volunteers including Courtney Boucher and Christyanna Durand, who are chairing the event. They would love our community's help with sponsorships, auction items, buying tables & tickets, & marketing this incredible event! We are excited to announce that we have partnered with St. Thomas Preservation Hall in downtown Wilmington to host this fun-filled evening of dancing, light dining, & bidding on some amazing auction items - all to benefit our students and our teachers! - So plan ahead & **Save the Date**. 2. **On Friday, December 9th** the New Hanover Community Endowment (NHCE) announced its 2022 Cape Fear Opportunities and Needs grant recipients which included CFCI. This was the endowment's inaugural round of investments in the community. The NHCE distributed more than \$9 million to various nonprofits in New Hanover County including a grant to CFCI in the amount of \$80,000 which will be used to support the school's mission of cultivating curiosity by providing students with opportunities to experience field experiences in the community and beyond. The school will use the funding to help purchase an activity bus that is capable of transporting an entire grade level to and from field experiences grounded in inquiry. We provided extensive information on CFCI's mission, goals, and plans for use of the funds that would be allocated. The endowment received over 291 applications and distributed one-time, non-renewable grants to a small number of organizations with missions that aligned with the endowment's overall goals. We are thankful to have been positioned to apply and be chosen for the Endowment's inaugural grant. We plan to purchase the bus in 2023 prior to the end of the school year. We are excited about this outstanding opportunity and look forward to sharing more details with you soon.

Holidays Around the World Academy - Loving the Latkes!



Ms. Jordan's class joined in the latke making with Ms. Baldwin's holiday academy students.

It was quite exciting with the potato shredding and the onion chopping and the egg cracking! Potato pancakes (called latkes) are meant to symbolize **the miracle of Hanukkah**, when the oil of the menorah in the ransacked Second Temple of Jerusalem was able to stay aflame for eight days even though there was only enough oil for one day. The symbolism comes in the form of the oil in which latkes are fried.



Potato Latkes by Parent Co.

Potato Latkes **Makes:** 12-15 latkes **Prep time:** 25 minutes **Total time:** About 1 hour

Ingredients:

- 2 ½ lbs Yukon Gold Potatoes (3 or 4 good sized potatoes) peeled and cut into large pieces
- 1 small onion, peeled and cut into quarters
- 2 eggs
- 3/4 cup panko breadcrumbs
- 11/4 tsp salt
- 1 tsp black pepper
- about 1/3 cup peanut or vegetable oil for frying



Instructions:

- Using a box grater, or the large holed shredder attachment on your food processor (highly recommended!) grate the potatoes.
- 2. Immediately place the shreds in a large bowl and cover with cold water. Set aside
- Shred the onion quarters in the same way. Set aside.
- 4. Drain the potato shreds well in a colander, than place in the middle of a large, clean kitchen towel or several layers of cheesecloth.
- 5. Place the shredded onions on top of the potatoes.
- 6. Twist up the towel and, holding it over the potato bowl, squeeze as much liquid out as you can. you want the mixture to be as dry as possible.



Instructions continued

- 1. After squeezing, rinse and dry the bowl, and place the potatoes and onions back in.
- 2. Add the eggs, breadcrumbs, salt, and pepper and mix well, making sure everything is incorporated.
- Heat your oil to medium high. You can see if it's ready for frying by dropping a small bit of potato in. It should bubble up immediately. If not, wait another minute. If it pops and splutters like crazy, turn it down just a bit.
- 4. Squeeze about 1/4 cup of the mixture in your hands to make a small pancake, then carefully drop into the oil using a spatula or spider.
- 5. Fry for 2-3 minutes on each side, until the latkes are deep golden brown.
- 6. Drain off excess oil on paper towels.
- 7. Serve with applesauce and sour cream, maybe some sliced scallions, and serve HOT!
