












Social Emotional Learning at CFCI



Bridge Building Beyond the Basics in Grade 5




What is the purpose of a toothpick bridge?

Change in Our Chromebook Protocols

For the past 6 years, CFCI has been a 1-1 school with students having access to Chromebooks in grades 2-8 and iPads in Grades K-1. During that time we have had many opportunities to assess the benefits of having a 1-1 program at our school. These include:

- Increased student engagement and participation
- Increased familiarity with technology that helps prepare our young learners for a more tech driven world
- The ability for teachers to access unlimited digital resources such as apps, interactive websites, digital media, games and more
- Increased equity in our learning environment

Along with the benefits, we have found that there have been challenges that include increased screen time and budget concerns (including management of devices.)


This past school year, our Technology Committee had many discussions about the 1-1 program. Looking to mitigate some of the negative aspects while supporting students and teachers with

what has become an important tool in our learning environment, we have decided to try a new approach to our 1-1 program for this school year. Our plan is to limit the use of chromebooks to the classroom, they will no longer go home with students each day. Instead, chromebooks will assigned to classrooms (not students) and be available as a resource for students during the school day. The intent is to be purposeful in how students utilize chromebooks for learning and minimize the amount of damage that is occuring with chromebooks traveling from classroom to classroom as well as from school to home. On occasion, a teacher may assign a special project that will require students to take a chromebook home but this will be an exception to the norm. The technology committee, classroom teachers, school leadership, students, and families will all be a part of monitoring the usefulness and merits of this new plan. If you have any concerns or questions, please do not hesitate to reach out. We appreciate your support and look forward to a successful implementation.

Separation Anxiety

Many kids and teens experience separation anxiety or school refusal, especially at the beginning of a new school year. Here are some tips that parents & guardians can follow to help ease the transition back to school:



- Be supportive and understanding of their fears, yet firm! Explain that not going to school is not an option.
- If they complain about feeling sick, explain that sometimes worry or fear can cause physical symptoms as well, such as a stomachache.
- Praise them for even the small accomplishments! Reward and praise for waking up, getting dressed, and getting in the car.
