
















Cape Fear Memorial Bridge Construction Update

Students created a digital or physical demonstration of their change, and included a real life example of their selected change in their presentation.



8th Grade Opportunity! Step Up to STEM at Elizabeth City State Univ Summer 2024

Greetings,

My name is Lura Jones and I serve as the Communications/Marketing Specialist for the Division of Extended Learning at the North Carolina School of Science and Mathematics (NCSSM). The purpose of this email is to share with you information about the Step Up to STEM program.

Step Up To STEM is a free, residential summer program offered through NCSSM. The program uses real-world subjects to challenge rising 9th and 10th graders across North Carolina and build their skills in science, math, technology, and communications. The program is designed to provide STEM opportunities and support for students from groups historically underrepresented in STEM fields and college attendance, including but not limited to students who identify as African American/Black, Hispanic/Latino, Native American, Native Hawaiian or other Pacific Islander, or female; students from low-income households; and students from the three NC U.S. Congressional Districts (1, 3, 11) with the lowest proportion of students pursuing post-secondary education after graduating from high school. The program is free and available to students who are residents of North Carolina. Students who are accepted into and complete the program as rising ninth graders are then offered a spot to return for a second summer of programming.

Students can apply online to the program during the eighth grade (applications for summer 2024 will open December 1, 2023 and remain open through February 8, 2024), and students who are accepted into the program have the opportunity to participate in two summers of programming (as rising 9th graders and rising 10th graders). For the past two years, NCSSM has offered Step Up to STEM on the campus of Elizabeth City State University (ECSU) and will offer the program again this summer. The dates for Summer 2024 are July 7-12. Step Up to STEM at ECSU is designed specifically for students from Eastern North Carolina, giving students from this region early exposure to a university setting.

We will be hosting Step Up to STEM virtual office hours to answer any questions that parents, students, and/or educators have about the Step Up to STEM application process. Virtual office hours will be held from **4:00 pm - 6:00 pm** on the following dates:

- December 7, 2023
- January 25, 2024
